Description: From 1968-1970 the institution offered 099 English and 099 Mathematics in a summer program known as the Remedial Reinforcement Program. Fall 1971-1974 this program was offered in a major semester. "Out of the Remedial Reinforcement Program developed the Department of Foundation Studies, funded for three years ...1974-1975 by Title III-AIDP money...1981 ...named a model project by the Joint Dissemination Review Panel of the Department of Education, Washington, DC....first post-secondary institution, previously funded by Title III, to be named a model project." (FSP Self-Study, 1998) The Remedial Reinforcement Program fell under the Division of Social Science and with successive organizational restructuring The Foundation Studies Program has been part of the College of Arts & Sciences, and the College of Humanities & Social Sciences. In 2005 the University decided that further enhancements were needed to the Foundation Studies Program resulting in the proposed enhancements: The Bridge Program was the focus of the Quality Enhancement Program (QEP) submitted as part of the University's 2006 SACS Reaffirmation documentation (SEE A-2010-06)

In AY2009-2010 The Foundation Studies Program evolved into a stand-alone department: The Bridge Program.

Collection includes annual reports and action plans, assessment plans and reports, internal self-studies, consultative reports, and reports submitted to accrediting agencies.
